PROJECT ABSTRACT AND SELECTED ALTERNATIVE:
 As the Responsible Official, J. Sharon Heywood, Forest Supervisor Shasta-Trinity National Forest, signed a Record of Decision (ROD) on June 1, 2009 for the Browns Project. The decision is based on the Revised Final Environmental Impact Statement (RFEIS) and public comments for the Browns Project. The Browns Project is located on the north end of the community of Weaverville, south of the Trinity Alps Wilderness and west of Trinity Reservoir. The selected action is Alternative 4 as described in the Revised Final EIS with modifications (hereafter referred to as Modified Alternative 4). Alternative 4, as proposed in the Revised Final EIS, would address increasing fuel loads and overstocked forest conditions by thinning approximately 543 acres of overcrowded forest stands; construct, use, and restore landings on approximately 25 acres in areas of currently understocked stands and/or

heavy fuels accumulation; apply a combination of fuels treatments (on the harvested areas and landings) to reduce fuel loading and/or fuel continuity on approximately 568 acres; reconstruct approximately 2.5 miles of existing road by resurfacing, and replacing culverts; and decommission a total of approximately 7 miles of road (the specific actions to be taken on the various roads in the project can be found in Appendix C of the Revised Final EIS). Modifications to Alternative 4 include reducing landing size from 2 1/2 acres to 1/2 acre. Within the project area, this modification reduces the total acres used for landings from 25 to 7; the 18 acres no longer used for landings will be thinned. Total acres thinned under Modified Alternative 4 is estimated at 561 acres. Additional design features and mitigation measures, developed as a result of field reviews and meetings with interested publics, have been added to the existing project design criteria and are included in the Record of Decision. This decision is based on conclusions and findings disclosed in the RFEIS. Decision Subject to Appeal

This decision is subject to administrative review (appeal) pursuant to 36 CFR Part 215. Appeals including attachments must be filed within 45 days following the publication date of this legal notice in the Record Searchlight, Redding, CA. Attachments received after the 45 day appeal period will not be considered. The publication date in the Record Searchlight, newspaper of record, is the exclusive means for calculating the time to file an appeal. Those wishing to appeal this decision should not rely upon dates or timeframe information provided by any other source. Individuals or organizations that provided comments or otherwise expressed interest in the project by close of the comment period are eligible to appeal the decision pursuant to 36 CFR 215.13. It is the appellant's responsibility to provide sufficient project-specific evidence and rational, focusing on the decision, to show why the decision should be reversed. The notice of appeal must meet the appeal content requirements at 36 CFR 215.14. PUBLIC NOTICE LEGAL NOTICE OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON THE JONES THIN PROJECT

The Forest Service, Shasta-Trinity National Forest, South Fork Management Unit, has made a preliminary assessment that this proposal falls within a category of actions listed in the Forest Service NEPA Handbook (FSH) that are excluded from documentation in an Environmental Assessment (EA) or Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and there are no extraordinary circumstances that would preclude use of the category [FSH 1909.15-31.2 Category 6. Timber stand and/or wildlife habitat improvement activities which do not include the use of herbicides or do not require more than one mile of low standard road construction (Service level D, FSH 7709.56)].

The proposal is to thin approximately 490 acres of 43-48 year old plantations and perform maintenance work on approximately 5.5 miles (200 acres) of an existing fuel break in the area burned in the 1959 Jones Fire, approximately 6 miles southwest of Wildwood, California [Township 29 North, Range 11 West, Sections 26, 27, 28, 29, 32, 33, 34 and 35; and Township 28 North, Range 11 West, Sections 2, 3, 4, and 11 (Mount Diablo Meridian)]. A preliminary memorandum detailing the proposal is available for review at the Hayfork Ranger Station, 111 Trinity Street, Hayfork, CA 96041. This comment period is intended to provide those interested in or affected by this proposal an opportunity to make their concerns known prior to a decision being made by the Responsible Official. Those who provide comments or otherwise express interest in the proposal by the close of the comment period will be eligible to appeal the decision pursuant to 36 CFR part 215 regulations.

Written, facsimile, hand-delivered, oral, and electronic comments concerning this action will be accepted for 30 calendar days following publication of this legal notice in the Redding Record Searchlight (June 9, 2009).
